STATEMENT OF CONCERNS NO. 29768 AND 29810**

Dear Ms. King:

You are receiving this letter because you filed a statement of concern on behalf of Athabasca Chipewyan First Nation (ACFN) about the Applications. The Alberta Energy Regulator (AER) has reviewed your statements of concern, along with the application, the applicable requirements, and other submissions or information about the application and has decided that a hearing is not required under an enactment or otherwise necessary to consider the concerns outlined in your statements of concern.

In its review of your concerns, the AER considered the following:

- The application area is within the boundary of the Lower Athabasca Regional Plan (LARP), which addresses acceptable land disturbance standards in relation to wildlife and management of cumulative impacts on a regional basis. The subject exploration activities are permitted under LARP.
- The Applications are within the traditional lands identified by the ACFN where its members conduct traditional activities.
- The AER is satisfied that proper and responsible completion of Teck's oil sands exploration program, including the construction, operation and abandonment of infrastructure associated with the current applications, will result in minimal lasting disturbance or impact on the environment and natural resources, and is not expected to contribute to cumulative effects. Concerns regarding impacts from Teck's Frontier project or other future projects should be raised in the context of those proceedings.

- Teck's applications are intended to further delineate the area for its Frontier project and this additional information about the resource is considered to support the goals of efficient and environmentally responsible development.
- ACFN has provided no "hard information" about locations where land within or affected by the OSE programs is used by ACFN or how its members may be affected.¹ The information provided is more general in nature and does not indicate if or how ACFN members may be directly and adversely affected by the application.
- Many of ACFN's concerns were addressed in decision 2013 ABAER 017 on Teck's 2013 winter drilling program.
- The ACO advised on January 1, 2015, that Teck's consultation with ACFN was adequate.

Based on the above and having regard for all of the information before the AER, you have not demonstrated that ACFN may be directly and adversely affected by the application.

The AER has issued the applied-for authorization and licences and this is your notice of that decision. Copies of the authorizations are attached. You can view copies of the licences at the links listed below:
